Music Department Refurbishment - helpful and successful consultation has been held with the residents of Mill Lane regarding the refurbishment of the School's music department. A planning application for the enabling works for this project, due to commence this summer, has now been submitted; and this will be followed shortly by an application for the full works, in anticipation of being able to start the project at the end of the year.

Anyone can be an appropriate adult provided they are over the age of 18 and pass suitability criteria through criminal record checks

## WILL I NEED TRAINING?

Some basic training taken from code C of the Police & Criminal Evidence act is necessary for you to fully understand your role. We may also ask you to undertake a period of shadowing with one of our existing appropriate adults, just to get you in the swing of things

## DO I RECEIVE EXPENSES?

Subject to force Policy, we will cover all reasonable travelling expenses
